

Kenojuak Ashevak Memorial Award Nomination Form 2022–23

The Inuit Art Foundation is now accepting nominations for the 2023 Kenojuak Ashevak Memorial Award (KAMA).

Established by generous members of the Inuit art community in 2014 to honour the life and work of the late Kenojuak Ashevak, the award is a biennial prize created to support the practice of an Inuk artist by facilitating opportunities for artistic development and career growth.

Benefits: New and expanded in 2023!

New this year, the Kenojuak Ashevak Memorial Award now recognizes artists on a longlist, shortlist and one winner, each receiving career-enhancing benefits, thanks to support from RBC Emerging Artists.

Longlist artists will receive \$2,500 and be featured in a dedicated catalogue. In addition to a \$5,000 prize, this year's shortlist will take part in a group exhibition in collaboration with <u>WAG-Qaumajuq</u> 2023. The winner, in addition to their prize of \$20,000, will receive a fully funded creative residency hosted by WAG-Qaumajuq, as well as a solo exhibition with accompanying catalogue and acquisition.

A longlist of ten artists will receive:

- A cash prize of \$2,500 each; and
- · A feature in a dedicated catalogue, to be distributed with the Inuit Art Quarterly.

A shortlist of five artists will receive:

- · A cash prize of \$5,000 each; and
- · A group exhibition at WAG-Qaumajuq 2023.

The winner will receive:

- A cash prize of \$20,000
- A fully funded creative residency at WAG-Qaumajuq in 2024; and
- A solo exhibition with accompanying catalogue and acquisition in partnership with WAG-Qaumajuq in fall 2025.

Eligibility:

For Nominees:

- Must be Inuk and living in Canada with citizenship, permanent residence or refugee status;
- Be at least 18 years old;
- Have specialized training in their artistic discipline (academic accreditation not a requirement);
- Recognized as a professional artist by their peers (i.e. artists working in the same artistic tradition) within the past 2 to 3 years:
- Have had their work recognized in a public capacity (i.e. in a gallery, publication, website, collection, etc.); and
- · Are committed to continually furthering their artistic practice.

For Nominators

- · Must have known the nominated artist in a professional capacity
- · Must be at least one of the following:
 - » A professional currently working in a Canadian university
 - » An established artist, curator, writer/critic or arts professional
 - » A private Canadian art dealer
 - » A family member so long as having worked together in a professional capacity. Please clearly outline this relationship in the notes of the nomination/application.

The IAF strongly encourages nominations from professional acquaintances including curators, gallerists, writers, critics, fellow artists and others in relevant fields, in support of an Inuit artist's practice. However, individual artists are also welcome to self-nominate. All applications will be assessed by an external committee of Inuit arts professionals.

Nominations will be accepted in English, French and Inuktut. All necessary translations will be provided by the IAF.

Please select visual support material mindfully, as committee members have limited time to consider each nomination. Images should be labeled numerically with the artist's name (01_name.jpg, 02_name.jpg, etc.). As an alternative, you may include a link to a web-based portfolio. If you choose to mail or fax your submission, you may print your visual support material or save to a USB drive. Please fill out the Support Material List which includes the title of work, date created, medium, and dimensions.

Video documentation should be uploaded to a site such as YouTube or Vimeo and linked in the application. If you are submitting via mail, please save files (mp4 or mov) via USB drive. Regardless of duration, please include full videos. Due to time constraints, the jury may only view up to 5 minutes of each video. Please note the excerpt you would prefer the jury view by including time marks in the documentation list.
